We are excited to announce that the *Doug Flutie, Jr. Foundation for Autism* has once again generously awarded Autism Connections a grant to support local families. The focus of this grant is to enhance the quality of life for people with autism. Autism Connections has been awarded \$13,200.00 to provide allocations to families of children with autism, which may be used for a wide variety of purposes related to best supporting an individual.

Families that meet the criteria will be eligible to receive a \$300.00 stipend to purchase items or fund activities that empower, enhance and provide opportunities for their child with autism. This grant cannot fund the purchase of iPads.

Those applying for the grant must meet the following criteria:

- ◆ *Must NOT be receiving services through the MA Autism Waiver Program*
 - ◆ *Must NOT be receiving services through the DDS DESE Program*
 - ◆ *Must NOT be receiving Adult DDS Services*
 - ◆ *Must NOT be receiving services through the DDS IFFS Program*
 - ◆ *Must be willing to turn in receipts from funds used and submit a thank you note to the Doug Flutie, Jr. Foundation for Autism*
- ◆ *Have a low to moderate household income*
 - ◆ *Must be a family of a child or adult child with a diagnosis on the autism spectrum residing at home*
 - ◆ *Must be living in Hampshire, Franklin, Hampden Counties, or the Worcester County towns of Royalston, Athol, Petersham, and Phillipston*

Annual Autism Conference

On April 27, we held our 28th Annual Autism Conference for professionals, family members, educators, self-advocates, agencies and exhibitors at The Log Cabin in Holyoke.

Speakers **Steve Silberman**, author of *NeuroTribes*, and **Al Condeluci**, author, consultant and CEO of CLASS (Community Living and Support Services) motivated participants with words of wisdom from their science and sociology perspectives.

An exhibition hall with more than 30 organizations related to autism services offered information about their services and books on many topics related to autism were available for purchase (get in touch with us if you would like a copy of that book list—the children's books were especially popular).

During lunch, our Director Karen Serra presented Community Awards to deserving individuals and organizations. It is important to us that we take time during our conference each year to honor community members who enhance the lives of children and adults with autism, and their families. We know how critical these relationships are, and how they can change our lives. We applaud all of our nominees this year and encourage our readers to think about honoring that special person with one of our community awards next year. The **Above and Beyond** award category celebrates people who actively demonstrate extraordinary commitment and creativity in their work with children and adults with autism and their families. Constance Janik, a preschool teacher at Bridge St School in Northampton, received this award. Constance was nominated by Lisa Modenos for the extra time and care she put into easing her son's transition into the school system and helping to make his daily school experience a success.

The **You Are There for Me** category honors caregivers who offer unique support and devotion to a family. The award was presented to Glafyra Ennis-Yentsch who was nominated by Lisa Modenos. Glafyra is a devoted grandmother to her grandson with autism, and offers him a unique connection and bond that enriches the lives of him and his parents.

The **Excellence in Advocacy** award honors professionals who have demonstrated ongoing and effective advocacy

for people with autism. This award was presented to Kathleen Moriarty, nominated by Nancy Jenks; and Linda Manning, nominated by Lisa Modenos. Kathleen was recognized for her long-standing support of students with autism in the Granby Schools, and for her tireless knowledge-sharing and fundraising. Linda facilitates Autism Connections' Western Mass Parent Support Group, and her dedication and practical supports have built this into a thriving group.

The **Collaboration & Connection** award honors excellence in teamwork to effect positive change for people with autism. There were many recipients of this award, thanks to some amazing collaborative initiatives. Erica Donovan nominated the following people and organizations: Abby Powers of the College Internship Program; Kristen Saharczewski of UCP Berkshire; Katrina Cardillo, Nancy Wiley and Sopheap Nhim of BCARC; Yvette Stoddard of Hillcrest Educational Foundation; Jeb Civello of BFAIR; Kristen Scharceski of UCP Berkshire; and Megan Cooper and Cathy Carchedi of AdLib Inc.

The second team was nominated by Lora Cortis. This is a team of a mother and school, human service and medical professionals working together to help a teenager with autism overcome her fear of the dentist in order to engage in a much-needed procedure. Award winners were Elizabeth DiBuono, Chris Purcell, Su Hoyle, and Paula Fredericks, The May School, and Baystate Medical Center.

We were very fortunate to have the partnership of *Radcliffe is the Reason, and Arthur Too! Fight for Autism* this year at our conference. The organization was our Presenting Sponsor, and also donated items for a raffle, including a large screen TV, an iPad mini, a FitBit, a Kindle Fire, and a mystery prize. Research Studies
